

The Morning Adhkar – To be recited in the Morning, ideally between Fajr and Sunrise

Forgive me, for there is none who can forgive sins except You.

Commentary: This Du'a is also referred to as 'Sayyidul Istighfaar' (The Master Du'a of seeking repentance). The Prophet added. "Whoever recites it during the day with firm conviction in it, and dies on the same day before the evening, he will be from the people of Paradise; and whoever recites it at night with firm conviction in it, and dies before the morning, he will be from the people of Paradise."

Commentary: The Prophet mentioned regarding the one who says this one hundred times in a day, "...one will receive the reward of freeing ten slaves, and one hundred good deeds will be written in his account, and one-hundred bad deeds will be erased from his account, and on that day he will be protected from the morning till the evening from the Shaytan, and nobody will be better than him except for the one who recited this more than him."

It is also authentically reported in other books of Hadith such as in the Musnad of Imam Ahmad (8719) that the Prophet mentioned a similar reward for the one who says this ten times in the morning as well as ten times in the evening.

Commentary: The Prophet seementioned that whoever recites Surahs Al-Ikhlas, Al-Falaq and An-Naas three times in both the morning and evening, then this will suffice him (as a protection) against everything.



Commentary: This particular Du'a is to be recited in the evening only. The Prophet advised reciting this Du'a when staying in a place during the evening/ night. By doing so, nothing shall do him any harm until he moves from that place.

Abu Hurairah also mentions that a man once came to the Prophet and complained that he had got stung by a scorpion during the night. The Prophet then went to teach him this Du'a and then mentioned to the man that if he had recited this it would not have harmed him.

The last two verses of Surah Al-Baqarah are to be recited **after** the sun has set and not before

285. The Messenger has believed in what was revealed to him from his Lord, and [so have] the believers. All of them have believed in Allah and His angels and His books and His messengers, [saying], "We make no distinction between any of His messengers." And they say, "We hear and we obey. [We seek] Your forgiveness, our Lord, and to You is the [final] destination."

286. Allah does not burden a soul except [with that within] its capacity. It will have [the consequence of] what [good] it has gained, and it will bear [the consequence of] what [evil] it has earned. "Our Lord, do not impose blame upon us if we have forgotten or erred. Our Lord, and lay not upon us a burden like that which You laid upon those before us. Our Lord, and burden us not with that which we have no ability to bear. And pardon us; and forgive us; and have mercy upon us. You are our Protector, so give us victory over the disbelieving people."

Commentary: Although included as part of the evening Adhkar, these two verses are to be recited after the sun has set, as oppose to the other evening Adhkar between 'Asr and Maghrib.

The Prophet mentioned that the one who recites the last two verses of Surah Al-Baqarah at night, it will 'suffice him'. The Scholars interpreted the word 'suffice' here to mean, suffice him as a means of protection from all types of evil and harm, including the Shaytan.
